Summary:

It turned out to be a typical Monterey peninsula day for golf, cold and damp. Largest BAGGsters contingent, in the history of BAGG, was at the course to showcase their golfing skill and battle the elements. In the end it turned out to be a one man show. Please join us in congratulating Ahmer Ali Khan as the winner of the 2020 edition of the BAGG Masters.

Poppy Hills is a beautiful and an unforgiving course. It requires understanding of the course to tame the beast and as was evident from the scores yesterday, very few can. Bunkers and the tricky greens provided the biggest challenge for the field of 32 players, Ahmer was the only one to beat his handicap. Round of applause and a standing ovation for the winner!

Ahmer is a tenacious competitor who fancies Poppy Hills golf course. He has won 3 out of the last 5 Masters along with 3^{rd} place finish in last year's tournament.

He started out of the gate strong and before anyone would realize what hit them he was sitting at -9 with 7 holes in and scoring 3 gross birdies along the way. With his execution Ahmer put pressure on the competition to play aggressive and everybody in the chase fell out of contention.

There was a period of four holes (8-11) where pressure started to mount and he gave back 5 strokes to the field which allowed Irfan to get back into competition and cut the lead to 1. However, Irfan was not able to keep the momentum going and lost 4 strokes in the last 4 holes to end the round at even par and securing 2^{nd} position. There were no last hole heroics needed this go around. Ahmer was able to regroup and focused on execution to shut the door on the entire field.

Well-deserved victory Ahmer! Not only he had the best net score, he had the 2nd best gross score. He was also the only player to record three gross birdies during the round.

Participation – Solid turn out	Finding good deals these days is a challenge and requires a minimum player commitment. We do understand that sometimes it is impossible to lock times in advance but please make an effort.	
Pace of Play – Reasonable	We spent roughly 5 hours and 15 min. Some groups did better whereas others had to wait a long time on some holes. This will always be a challenge for BAGG. We just need to keep an eye on reducing the time to 5 hours on every tournament. Keep working at it BAGG!	
After game hangout	Always an area of challenge especially when the location is far. Many thanks to Ahmer for picking up the tab for the BAGGsters who were left at the course and treating them to a socially distanced outdoor victory dinner.	

Areas of Improvement:

Weather	Turned out to be challenging day for golf. Cold weather made it difficult to swing the clubs. Winter months are always problematic to play in Monterey. Unfortunately this tournament got moved from March due to Covid. We need to keep the tournaments in Monterey area during the summer months	
Shared Carts	 Given the circumstances of 2020 and Poppy Hills being a NCGA home course, BC assumed that there will be no shared carts as they would want to set an example for other courses to follow. Tournaments played at other courses (Coyote Creek, Black Horse, Half Moon Bay to name a few) have almost made it mandatory to have a single rider cart. There is no specific language in the contract about carts. We have requested clarification from the course on this. Apologies to those who were not able to enjoy the round due to this.
