BC'19's assessment:

Positives:

Positives:	
Participation – A roaring success!	 30 out of 36 Members participated in Round 1. 2 walkovers were given due to injuries. 1 was due to schedule challenges. 17 out of 18 winners of Round 1 participated in Round 2. 1 member could not make it due to schedule challenges. 4 out of 4 winners of Round 2 participated in the final.
Willingness to change	Format of OOO always poses challenges with scheduling and it gets progressively difficult for Round 2 and Final. This year's weather added another wrinkle. While there were a couple of issues, for the most part BAGGsters were willing to accommodate opponents by working their schedule. High marks for BAGG spirit!
Level of Competition	3 out of 4 matches in Round 2 went to the file hole Final Round produced a photo finish with all the participants in the game till the very last hole (Summary of the final hole is captured below).
RC was active	This should never be considered a positive but this OOO turned out to be extra special! BAGG has held numerous tournaments over the years but never had one with so many variables. This required a thorough investigation to ensure the correct decision was made at the end. RC handled everything with the utmost professionalism. They were committed to not rush things, and were very deliberate in their fact finding. Kudos to them!

Areas of Improvement:

Weather	Turned out to be a major impediment for the tournament. Conditions were poor and players had to gut it out. Earlier months in the year can cause weather related challenges. Consider moving the major in the later months where the weather is expected to be better.
Changing of handicaps	It was always the intention to use latest handicaps to ensure fair play. Language in BC's communication did not accurately reflect that intention. This created confusion on the day of the final.
	To avoid this situation, BC should use the language written in BAGG Rule Book in its future communication regarding handicaps.
What about the Caddie?	There is first for everything. We would venture a guess here but this probably caught everyone by surprise. BAGG needs to have a clear language to handle this type of a situation in future.

Story of the 18th hole:

This is how the things unfolded...

Going into the 18th hole, Waheed was leading with 10 points, followed by Hassan and Faraz at 9. Ali was the caboose but within striking distance at 8 points.

Tee shots for Hassan, Ali and Waheed were in the fairway, Faraz's tee shot went left towards the hazard. Ali and Faraz tried to find his ball but had no luck. Faraz took a drop with a stroke penalty and played his 3rd shot, when he went ahead after playing his second ball, he found his original ball (*very unfortunate for Faraz, had he found his ball earlier, he would have won the championship*).

None in the 4-some were sure about the ruling so Faraz was asked to play with both balls. One the original ball, Faraz scored a net par and on the second ball he messed up and conceded (X) the hole. Waheed completely messed up his hole and conceded (X) the hole prior to reaching the green. Hassan and Ali were left to contend.

Hassan needed 1 point on the last hole to tie with Waheed and win since he had the most points in the back 9 compared to the rest. Ali needed to win 2 points on the last hole to tie with Waheed and win the tie breaker.

Story continues on the green...

Hassan was on the green in 3, \sim 30 feet away. Ali was on the green in 4, \sim 50 feet away. Ali had a stroke on Hassan so he needed two putts to secure 1 point and win the match. Ali two putted for a 6 (net par). Hassan 3-putted and failed to secure the crucial 1 point!

Drama continues...

Since Faraz had a net par on the original ball, Ali and Faraz secured 1 point each which made Ali end up at 9 points and Faraz tied with Waheed at 10 points with Faraz winning the tie-breaker. This is insane! You cannot make this stuff up.

RC deliberated for a day on the ruling of Faraz's original ball and ruled that it was not in play. Ali got 2 points for winning the last hole outright and tied with Waheed.

Per the tie breaker rules:

- Last 9 holes Both scored 5 points
- Last 6 holes Both scored 2 points
- Last 3 holes Ali scored 2 points and Waheed scored 1 point

This has been one of the closest OOO competition in BAGG's recent history (perhaps all time). Congratulations to Ali Saeed for out lasting and out playing his competition and winning the most grueling tournament in BAGG's annual schedule.
