Split Tee FAQs

Q: Slope already takes into account the difficulty for different tees. Then why does one player get extra strokes playing from a more difficult tee?

A: Think of it this way: two scratch players A and B are playing from Poppy 1 (66.0/125) and Poppy 4 (73/140) tees. Since they're scratch players their course adjusted handicaps are also 0. If both score 72, are they really tied when Player A played from a much easier tee? No. Player B should get strokes for playing from a more difficult tee. The number of strokes Player B gets is the difference of Course Rating i.e. 73-66 = 7.

Similarly for a non-scratch player C, the slope rating aims to give strokes to turn him into a scratch player from that tee. Now for player C to compete against another player playing different tees, same adjustment needs to be made using Course Rating as required for 2 scratch players playing from different tees.

Q: What's the super duper secret formula anyway for calculating strokes from different tees?

A:There is no secret formula. Procedure for calculating strokes from different set of tees is

Some highlights from the tournament:

<u>USGA Based Alternate and Best Ball:</u> Both Alternate and Best Ball formats were played using USGA rules with no BAGG local rules. This required a change in strategy on planning the tee off order for the players.

provided in USGA's handicapping manual. In a nutshell, course adjusted handicaps for all players are calculated. The lowest set of tees that any player is playing from becomes the base, and any player playing from a higher tee get additional strokes based on the difference of course rating.

Additional Strokes = Course Rating of Player's Tees - Course Rating of Lowest Tees being Played

Final Handicap = Player's Course Adjusted Handicap + Additional Strokes
